Re: Infringement of POLITICO® Marks and Domain Name


Gentlemen:

I am writing to follow up on our prior exchange of correspondence regarding the infringement by your client, Stephen Gutowski, of our client's POLITICO® and CAMPUS POLITICO® marks (collectively, the "POLITICO® Marks"). We have not received any response to our demand that Mr. Gutowski immediately cease all use of any marks or domain names that are confusingly similar to the POLITICO® Marks, including all use of the mark THE COLLEGE POLITICO and the domain name "thecollegepolitico.com," and that Mr. Gutowski promptly take all necessary steps to transfer "thecollegepolitico.com" domain name to our client.

As we stated previously, Mr. Gutowski's use of the mark THE COLLEGE POLITICO is actionable on the grounds that it infringes the trademark and other intellectual property rights of our client. Further, Mr. Gutowski's registration and use of the domain name "thecollegepolitico.com" is actionable under both the Anti-Cybersquatting Consumer Protection Act and the Uniform Dispute Resolution Policy, under which Capitol News could obtain a decision requiring the transfer of the domain name to our client. Indeed, Capitol News recently prevailed in just such an action and obtained an order compelling the transfer of the tory-politico.com domain name, which was being used for a political news web site.

Our client has been damaged, and continues to be damaged, by Mr. Gutowski's acts of infringement. If, by **September 1, 2010**, Mr. Gutowski does not verify in writing that he will permanently refrain from all future use of any name or mark that is confusingly similar to the POLITICO® Marks, and that he will transfer "thecollegepolitico.com" domain name to our client, we will have no choice but to advise our client to pursue its legal remedies.
